As you may recall Dr. Gori is also the postulator for the Causes of Carlo Acutis, the first millennial saint, and Father Emil Kapaun, the Army Chaplain and Medal of Honor recipient who died as a prisoner of war in North Korea. With Dr. Gori's hard work, both Causes have taken another significant step forward. Carlo Acutis' canonization is scheduled for 27 April 2025 and Father Kapaun was recently declared a Venerable Servant of God. As you can see, we have an exceptional postulator. The recent progression of the Causes of Carlos Acutis and Father Kapaun is positive. We are hoping to report more substantially on the progress of Father Capodanno's Cause soon. 
