Friends – Here we are in the last days of June – the month that our Church devotes to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Did you know that there is an amazing supporter story about Father Vincent and the Sacred Heart? Here it is:

Our supporter was a daughter in a family of four children. Her parents had consecrated their children to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as babies and practiced the Nine First Friday's Devotion given to St. Margaret Mary.

In 1967, her brother, a U.S. Marine, landed in Vietnam on 21 Aug – two weeks before Father Vincent was killed. On the night of 21 Sep, only a month after her brother arrived in Vietnam and over two weeks after Father Vincent had been killed, she had a terrible dream that her brother was horribly wounded and all alone on a battlefield. In her dream, she saw a Catholic chaplain run to help and comfort her brother. The chaplain said, "Don't worry, son, God is with us this good day."

As she woke from this awful nightmare, she called her father for comfort and found that he had experienced the same nightmare.

One week later, Marines came to the family home to tell them that her brother's entire unit had been killed. Her brother was the lone survivor but had subsequently died of his wounds. Marines who arrived and gave aid to her brother reported that before he died, he asked them to, "please thank the Padre for helping me to die well."

These Marines promised to honor his request but there were no Chaplains assigned to the unit nor in the area – they did not know who the priest could be.

Years passed, and a friend sent our supporter a picture of a Navy Chaplain who was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor – you guessed it – she recognized our Servant of God, Father Vincent Capodanno, as the priest from her dream.

May our Lord and His Servant, Father Vincent Capodanno be with you and yours.

Father Vincent - still influencing souls:

- From a Marine Warrant Officer, "....my family has been praying for Father Capodanno's intercession. My nephew and his wife are currently pregnant with their second child and first son. This unborn son has been diagnosed with anencephaly (he does not have a brain or skull) but still has a brain stem, so he continues to grow and kick and move but most likely will be stillborn. If he survives until birth he will almost certainly die within minutes of being born. We have been praying daily for Father Capodanno's intercession for the baby and his parents both for healing and the strength and grace the parents need as they carry the baby to term. We are confident that Father Capodanno will take this prayer to the foot of the cross."
- Fred Smith the founder of FedEx has died of a massive heart attack at the age of eighty. For those of you who do not know, he served with Father Vincent in Vietnam and was a significant contributor as our Cause was getting started. We would not be where we are today if not for his support. Please pray for his soul – I'm sure Father Vincent met him and smiled....
