Father Vincent - still influencing souls:

From a supporter: "My cousin, the late Buddy B. Spivey was a 1st. Lieutenant USMC. He was a platoon commander in Vietnam from January 1966 until December 1966. He and Father Capodanno became close friends during this time. My cousin was wounded on 7 December 1966 on the feast day of the Blessed Mother. The influence Father Capodanno had on my cousin led to his eventual conversion to Catholicism on his death bed 47 years later. Bishop Anthony B. Taylor, Bishop of Little Rock, declared and blessed my cousin a "Catholic by Desire" after I told him the story of Father Capodanno. I was praying to Father Capodanno during this moment when miraculously, he was able to squeeze the Bishop's hand three times. My cousin was in a coma. He died shortly after this moment. Throughout my life, my cousin shared many stories with me about Father Capodonno."

<u>Rome Status:</u> Archbishop Broglio was able to meet with the Prefect for the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints in Rome to discuss our Cause and determined that a new group of Theological Consultants will be

assembled. This group will be responsible for reviewing the work that our three historians submitted in response to the questions raised in the first theological review. Recall that Dr. Gori is our postulator in Rome and he will be intimately involved in shepherding this effort. Please pray that Dr. Gori will guide our Cause wisely and that the Theological Consultants will be granted wisdom in their efforts.
